Re: 2024 Election Integrity Initiatives

## STRATEGIC PRIORITY/RESULT ACHEIVED:

Well Governed and Administered County

## **DISCUSSION:**

To further enhance the public confidence in our election processes and election integrity, implementing the following initiatives is a crucial component.

Firstly, providing funding to our municipalities to have the ability to voluntarily offer extended inperson absentee voting hours beyond what is typically offered during the in-person absentee voting time period leading up to the November 5, 2024 election, allows for more voter participation at the voter's convenience, ensuring broader accessibility and transparency.

Supporting voluntary municipal-level audits with dedicated funds can provide granular scrutiny of voting procedures and outcomes, bolstering public trust. Expanding upon this approach, by also funding an additional countywide audit of all ballots cast in the November 5, 2024 election further underscores a commitment to thorough verification and accuracy. This is similar to previously done voluntary hand count audits at the county level, such as November of 2022.

Additionally, by providing funding to buy-back the central count machines previously purchased by our municipalities with central count locations, allowing for those specific municipalities to have the opportunity to eliminate the central count process, replacing it with the standard precinct-based counting process.

Lastly, investing in robust physical protection for the storage and transport of our voting equipment, ensuring that our voting equipment remains secure and protected.

Together, these measures can significantly reinforce the electoral process's integrity and assist in restoring public confidence in the democratic system.
